Today marks the 2nd last day of Remote Schooling. Woo Hoo!! As I said at the end of last term this is not something I ever thought we would have to do as a school.


The F-2 students have settled in beautifully over the past 2 weeks and they are all getting used to our new normal. We anticipate the 3-6 students will be exactly the same. While things are definitely a little different with increased cleaning of the school during the day, children washing hands more regularly as well as sanitising each time they enter the classroom etc it is running smoothly.

Our new pick and drop off arrangements are going well at the moment and we hope with the increased traffic next week that it continues to run smoothly. Just a reminder families who drive their children to & from school and whose surname begins with A-K you are allocated to the church car park. A staff member is on duty from 8.30am for you to drop off and the children will be brought out to Williams Lane at 3.10pm. Please ensure you follow the directions on the map so we can reduce the risk of blocking the buses on Guys Rd. Families from L-Z you are allocated to pick up and drop off on Bridge St. Your finish time remains at 3.20pm. Staff are on hand in the afternoon to assist your child to get to your car safely. We ask that you please do not gather around the outside of the gate.

As we are required to limit the number of visitors and adults on the school premises we ask that you do not enter the school grounds unless you have pre arranged this with the office. If you have a pre arranged appointment please ensure you enter from the Guys Rd gate.

For the time being we will be running our student led assembly on a Monday morning via Google Meet. Classes will participate in the assembly from their individual classrooms using their interactive TV's. Unfortunately at this point we are unable to open these up to parents virtually however I am trying to find a solution to this.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for all the support you have given your children and the staff over this past term. You have all been dedicated to your child's education and extremely supportive to all concerned. We are looking forward to teaching children face to face again.
























# Queens Birthday public holiday
