At the end of the term last year, students in 4/5 and 5/6 participated in a Regional Rail Revival Design Challenge during STEM lessons. Students were asked to pitch their ideas about the future of public transport, in response to the question: *What does the smart and connected city of 2050 look like?*

Their ideas needed to respond to one or more of the competition's themes:

- Technology or app-driven transport solution e.g. helping passengers to plan their onward journey
- Communications campaign e.g. promoting safety by design
- Product prototype e.g. a revolutionary train seat
- Building and system design e.g. the railway station of the future.

All students came up with such inspiring and innovative ideas that impressed the judges. Out of many regional schools across Victoria, our students did so well, with two teams from our school, out of a small selection, made it through to the final round. Bella Vine and Ella Cochrane made a fantastic presentation and proudly represented our school with their creative ideas and need to be commended on a great effort. Our other team consisting of Allegra Bogaert, Cassidy Chipperfield, Amarli Muranty, Claudia Donohue and Aslyn Bye were so impressive they came 1st in their category and won a set of robots for our school. 
