Dear Families of St Joseph's,

Colder days are certainly with us and all children should now be wearing full winter uniform. All additional items of clothing such as scarves, beanies etc should be in school colours.

School socks are grey or white (tights are grey) in winter and need to be visible above the ankle. Other colours and socks with logos are not permitted.
