Dear Families of St Joseph's,

This week we are focusing on Child Safety and building awareness of situations in which our children may not be safe. It is vital that they have a strong voice, especially when they are uncomfortable and it is critical that the adults in their lives listen and respond to that voice. I encourage you to speak openly with your children about how they should respond when they don't feel safe and ensure that they have trusted adults in their lives whom they can talk to. Often this is someone close, but beyond the immediate family like an uncle, aunty or perhaps a sporting coach. A person like this can be a wonderful support to you as a parent too. As teachers, our first priority is the safety of your children and I am proud of the way all staff at our school care for the children. You can be assured that we adhere to detailed policies which you can refer to on our website.

Cyber Safety

It has come to our awareness that some children are engaging on social media platforms which are beyond their age group. Some children are also involved in online gaming, often late into the night. We encourage you to supervise this closely and if it is a problem for your family, consider turning off internet access during unsuitable times of the day.

We have been blown away with the amount of mushrooms we have grown and got to see three different types of mushrooms in the process button mushrooms, cap mushrooms and large flat mushrooms. Last week we picked the mushrooms and enjoyed them raw and cooked on mini pizzas.





Information from the Fathering Project

This week is <u>child protection week.</u> As fathers and father figures, our first and foremost role is to protect children in every way possible.

Starting the conversation about body boundaries and protective behaviours with your child helps to equip and empower them, now and into the future.

Continuing to engage in warm, supportive fathering is shown to support the emotional and social development of children. Provide a safe environment, opportunity for open conversation and teachable moments.

Top Tips

- 1. Talk to your child about personal space and body boundaries. What is ok, and what isn't.
- **2. Try 'what if' scenarios.** Make "What if someone gives you a big hug and you don't like it?" "What if someone is hurting you when you are playing?"
- **3. Teach them to trust their feelings.** If it doesn't feel right to them, they have the power to say 'no' or 'stop' and tell you about it as soon as they can.



Student Attendance Policy

At St Joseph's the safety of your children is our number one priority. Because of this and to ensure we are inline with Government Requirements we must have parental notification for every student absence.

If your child is away, or is going to be away, the easiest way to let us know is via the 'parent notified absence' option in PAM. These absence types can be entered in advance and you can enter for more than one day in the case of a family holiday. If you miss the 9:30am cut off for this notification process you can call the school 56552040 or email office sikorumburra.catholic.edu.au.

If we have not heard from a parent by 9:30am a no reply SMS will be sent to the first contact listed in SIMON. If you receive this SMS please follow the above step and either email or call the school.

If we have not had parental contact by 10am the contacts listed in SIMON will be called. We will continue to call, SMS and Email until we have made contact with a parent, guardian or emergency contact. We do this so that we can ensure you are aware that your child has not attended school that day and to get notification of the reason for their absence eg, illness, holiday or parent choice.

Thank-you for helping us complete this task each day and ensure student safety.
