

Our Foundation, Grade 1 and Grade 2 students will be attending an excursion to the Melbourne Zoo tomorrow Friday 21st October. Students are to wear full sports uniform and bring their lunch, snack, hat and water bottle in a small backpack. Please include a wet weather coat if needed. Students will be travelling to and from the excursion by bus and given the possible traffic at these times we have opted to run slightly outside of normal school hours to ensure we get the best experience possible at the Zoo. Please have students at school no later than 8:15am ready to leave at 8:30am. We expect to be back by approximately 3:45pm however, we will notify families via SMS when the bus gets closer.

Junior News

Today in Year One we had an online safety incursion. We discussed the importance of not sharing our personal information online; checking with a trusted adult when going online about the sites we are going to or the information shared with us; and having a balance between screen time and 'green' time, e.g. reading, lego, bike riding etc.

Kids had a great time singing, dancing and playing games. We encourage you to continue

having the conversation at home with your children. Grade 3/4 News

In Grade 3/4 this term, we have been exploring what it means to be creative. We have been concentrating on animation and we started by making simple flipbooks. Now we are making stop motion videos using claymation figures and the iMovie app. We have had to do lots of editing to make them work smoothly and we also had to add audio and sound effects to our videos.

Gr 5/6 Blue News

Gr 5/6 are also focusing on creativity this term. This week we have unveiled two Habits of the Mind: Creating, Imagining and Innovating plus Striving for Accuracy. In Religious Education we are learning about the meaning

of mission and determining ways people can make a personal response. In the Parable of the Sheep and Goats, found in Matthew 25:31-46, we learn that Christians are strongly encouraged to take action to help those in need. In this parable, Jesus makes it clear that a life worthy of the reward of Heaven must involve actively helping people in need. Jesus explains that helping a person, whoever they are, is just the same as helping Jesus himself. By registering for Socktober and raising money we are actively helping the people of Ethiopia who are in need. We will all take responsibility for bringing along recycled items to make sockballs with by Tuesday, October 25. Our class completed a Cold Write on Wednesday which is just like a Big Write but with no prior Hometalk or resources to help. Our writing is becoming noticeably more descriptive

and as independent writers we are focusing on achieving our personal writing goals in regard to using extended vocabulary, outstanding openers, connectives and punctuation. Fractions are our Maths focus. Students are working at their level to

convert fractions into equivalent fractions and convert improper fractions into mixed numbers and vice versa. We have also practised adding and subtracting fractions with the same or related denominators. The T20 Blast cricket competition was a fantastic day on Tuesday for our girl and boy's team which saw students supporting one another and working together as a team to achieve their best result. Thank you to the parents and grandparents who came to support St Joseph's. We are excited to report that our Grade 6 Graduation preparations have begun!

Our juniors enjoyed having some of their senior buddies helping them during their literacy and numeracy block this week. It is wonderful to see the seniors stepping up as leaders and the beautiful interactions between the students. Thanks seniors!









STEM

During this term, 5/6 will be looking at different Holidays and Traditions in different countries. We started by learning about Christmas in Sweden, students read and learnt about St Lucia's Day and the tradition of the Yule Goat. Students researched information on the Yule Goat and then had to design and create one out of pipe cleaners.







Regional Athletics Carnival

A big congratulations to Amity, Zara, Lily, Georgia, Toby and Liam who participated in the Regional Athletics Carnival last Tuesday at Newsborough. After competing in our House Athletics, they successfully made it through the District and Division levels to compete at this carnival, where they came up against students from all across Gippsland.
