Socktober

Last Tuesday, St Joseph's celebrated World Mission Month by way of *Socktober*, an initiative of global mission aid agency Catholic Mission that raises awareness and funds for critical projects supporting vulnerable children in developing countries.

Socktober was the culmination of learning and fundraising efforts that the students carried out throughout the month of October, for a farming project in rural Ethiopia, where families grapple with the issues of food insecurity and malnutrition.

During the day students enjoyed mission activities, a Socktober Shootout (Goal Shooting) and a liturgy.

Many students created a "sockball" — a makeshift soccer ball made of recycled materials like old socks. This activity helped students understand the reality of children who cannot afford high-quality balls found in schools across Australia. It's important for our students to understand why children in places like Ethiopia need our support, and to expose some of the root causes of poverty. In doing this, we are preparing our students to be responsible leaders of change in the future.

The soccer part of the program, especially the sockball activity, helps the students to understand that while we might be more privileged than children in Ethiopia, we are very similar at a fundamental level: in our love of games and sports.

Thank you to the families who signed up to Socktober and sought sponsorship from friends and family through their online fundraising pages. We have raised \$430.00 to date.

Our whole school community is hopeful we can make a big impact for children in need in Ethiopia. Our students understand how blessed they are to live in Australia, and they are always ready to pray, advocate, and act for others who are less fortunate.
