The Fathering Project

We know switching off from work can be a challenge, especially if you work from home and have younger children wanting your attention.

Whether you work from home, are coming home from the office or on-site. Making time to decompress to enter dad-mode is important.

Don't feel guilty! If you need a bit of time to "switch off" and reset before you switch "back on again" after you knock off, this is perfectly fine.

Reset, channel your "dad-mode" and then show up for your kids.

Top Tips to get into dad-mode after work

1. On your way home from your workday or shift use the travel time to destress so when you walk in the door, you're switched on, in dad-mode.

2. Make time to connect when you get home from work. i.e., around the dinner table, or at bedtime.

3. If you are working away or living apart, make time to reach out whenever possible. Phone or text older children from work or after school with a brief message to let them know you are thinking of them.
