Uniform

As you are aware Burra Sports are stepping away from the supply of uniforms and so we are currently working with a new supplier. Staff

Home Learning

After careful consideration, including the review of current research, we are moving away from formal, set homework tasks. We recognise that, while there is consistency in the school environment, each home is different and that the traditional "homework" model often causes unnecessary stress. Instead, our expectation is that all children spend at least 15 minutes each day reading. This includes your child reading aloud and being read to. We know that a love of reading is fostered in the home and that children who read every day are more successful learners at school.

If your child wishes to complete additional practice tasks at home, please speak with their teacher, however this work will not be handed in or marked...it will simply be an option for extra practice of the work that is being taught in the classroom. Your child's teacher will provide you with more detailed information about how you can support your child's learning at home.

Parent Teacher Conversations will be happening during week 4, on Tuesday and Wednesday, from 3:30pm to 6pm. You will receive an invitation to book a time via PAM. If you usually attend a Program Support Group (PSG) meeting for your child, you will not need to book in for these meetings. You will be contacted separately to schedule a meeting with our Learning Adjustment Leader, Carole Livesey and your child's classroom teacher.

Communication

Please ensure that you have access to PAM which is our online communication system. You will receive emails via PAM in regard to events and activities. You may also contact your child's teacher via email, however please be aware that they do not necessarily check emails during the teaching day and that matters which require their immediate attention should be communicated via a phone call to Kath in the office or an email sent to office@sjkorumburra.catholic.edu.au.

Although we understand that it may be more convenient to send an email to us early in the morning or later in the evening, please be aware that you should not expect a response beyond the hours of 8:30am to 4pm.
