

Operation Christmas Child is a hands-on way for us to bless children in need across the world by filling shoeboxes with toys, hygiene items, school supplies, and fun gifts that they will receive in time for Christmas.

There are different ways you can be involved and make a difference:

1. You can donate items for the Christmas shoeboxes suitable for children aged 2-14 years. Children can bring your family's donations to school and senior students will pack the Christmas boxes ready for sending. Here are some ideas:
